

1910.38 - Emergency Action Plans

- Audience: All
- Training Frequency: Initial and Periodic
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Procedures for reporting a fire or other emergencies
 - Procedures for emergency evacuation
 - Procedures for employee head counts
 - Contact information if more information is needed about the plan or the duties of the employees

1910.39 – Fire Prevention Plans


- Audience: All
- Training Frequency: Initial and Periodic
- Required content but not limited to:
 - A list of all major fire hazards, proper handling and storage procedures for HAZMAT
 - Procedures to control HAZMAT accumulations
 - Procedures for regular maintenance
 - Names or job titles for employees responsible for maintaining equipment to prevent fires

1910.95 - Occupational Noise

- Audience: All employees exposed at or above 85 decibels for 8-hour TWA
- Training Frequency: Initial and when exposure changes
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Effects of noise on hearing
 - Hearing protection selection and instructions
 - Monitoring program
 - Access to information and training materials

1910.120 - HAZWOPER


- Audience: All employees...
- Training Frequency: Initial & annually (8-hrs)
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Safety and health hazards employees should expect to encounter
 - Control measures or techniques
 - Monitoring procedures for assessing exposure
 - Hands on training with PPE



1910.132 - PPE

- Audience: Employees required to use PPE
- Training Frequency: Initial, change in workplace, and when the PPE changes
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Hazard assessment of the job/task
 - Demonstration of PPE knowledge
 - Retraining requirements






1910.146 - P.R.C.S.

- Audience: Authorized entrants/attendants and rescue personnel
- Training Frequency: Initial and periodic for entrants/attendants or initial and annual for rescuers
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Types of confined spaces
 - PRCS Program and roles of the employees
 - Evaluation of the space
 - Permit system




1910.147 - LOTO

- Audience: Employees who service or maintain equipment
- Training Frequency: Initial and periodic
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Recognition of hazardous energy sources
 - Trained on the purpose and use of the energy control procedures
 - Prohibition of reenergizing machines or equipment

1910.151 - First Aid and Medical

- First Aid Definition:
- Audience: First aid providers & anyone else
- Training Frequency: Every two years for providers, and annually for others
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Location of first aid station, AED, or BBP kit
 - Location of the onsite nurse or PLHCP or the nearby hospital/clinic
 - Who to contact in the event of an injury



1910.157 – Fire Extinguishers

- Audience: All
- Training Frequency: Initial and annual
- Required content but not limited to:
 - General fire principals and hazards
 - Appropriate use of each class of Fire Extinguisher
 - Training with P.A.S.S.
 - Locations and classes of Fire Extinguishers onsite

1910.178 - P.I.T.


- Audience: All designated operators of forklifts
- Training Frequency: Initial, every three years, and when an employee has demonstrated the need for retraining
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Formal instruction
 - Practical training
 - Evaluation of the operator's performance

1910.1030 - Bloodborne Pathogens

- Audience: Employees with occupational exposure and first aid responders
- Training Frequency: Initial and annual
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Signs, symptoms, epidemiology of BB diseases
 - Modes of exposure
 - Employers control plan
 - HEP B Vaccine information

1910.1200 - Hazard Communication

- Audience: All employees exposed to hazardous chemicals, infectious agents, or pesticides
- Training Frequency: Initial, periodic, and when a new hazard is introduced
- Required content but not limited to:
 - Location of HAZCOM Program
 - Description of the hazards in the workplace
 - Protection Measures
